

Community Wellbeing and Resilience Grants Round 1 Funded Activities

Wentworth Healthcare, the provider of the Nepean Blue Mountains Primary Health Network, received funding through NSW Health and the Commonwealth Department of Health and Aged Care to support the mental health of those affected by the 2022 floods.

Our Community Wellbeing and Resilience Grants were awarded in two funding rounds to allow communities to choose their own way to respond to the losses, anxiety and distress they have experienced, as well as actively participate in their recovery. Round one provided **grants up to \$5,000**.

Applicants are residents in the affected communities and are not named for privacy reasons. Below are the organisations and community groups that have received funding on behalf of the applicants to assist these communities.
