

## Multidisciplinary Team Approach – Type 2 Diabetes in Primary Care Pilot Project

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

## 1. How many hours per week is the Diabetes Educator/Dietitian position?

In the application, we ask that interested parties provide the time they have available to devote to this project, given their current responsibilities and workload. Answers can be provided in either **days per week or days per month**.

Initially, to set the service up, there may be a greater investment of time for the allied health providers. During the project we will have regular team meetings to review the service model and adjust as needed. It is anticipated that commissioned allied health providers will provide services across 4-8 general practices for the duration of the project.

**Important note**: There will be a co-design period at the beginning of the project where the model of care will be determined by the project team (commissioned allied health providers, participating general practitioners, Wentworth Healthcare). We will be able to consider the availability of the providers in the design of the service. At minimum, there will be 2, 2-hour co-design sessions before service delivery commences. There is scope for services to be delivered 1-2 days/week across the participating general practices, however, the co-design will finalise these frequency details.
