

# 2025 Seasonal Influenza Vaccination Program

### **Community Pharmacy**

#### Please distribute to all pharmacist immunisers in your pharmacy

- 1. From April 2025, free influenza vaccines will be available to eligible people under the National Immunisation Program.
- 2. Pharmacist immunisers should target all Aboriginal people and medically-at risk patients, 5 years and over, pregnant women and people aged 65 years and over.
- 3. Prepare your pharmacy for the influenza season by reviewing the Influenza Vaccination Provider Toolkit 2025 available at <u>https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/flu-provider-toolkit.aspx</u>
- 4. **Confirm your pre-allocation** of influenza vaccines online between **9am Monday 17 February 2025 and 4.30pm Friday 7 March 2025**. Deliveries will begin when the influenza vaccine becomes available.

## Annual influenza vaccination is the single most effective way to protect your patients against influenza

- Influenza vaccination reduces the severity of influenza related illness and risk of influenza related hospitalisations and deaths.
- Australian studies suggest that in 2024, vaccinated individuals were about 60% less likely to attend general practice or be hospitalised with influenza than unvaccinated people.
- Health care providers are the most trusted source of vaccine information by patients. Prepare to
  discuss influenza vaccine recommendations; your vaccine recommendations matter. A suite of

#### Eligibility and timing of vaccinations

- Influenza vaccination is recommended for all people aged 6 months and over (**pharmacist immunisers are authorised to administer vaccines to people aged 5 years and over**).
- People at higher risk of serious influenza complications are eligible for free influenza vaccination under the National Immunisation Program.
- Vaccinating from mid-April provides protection before the peak season takes place.
- Prioritise all Aboriginal people and medically-at risk patients aged 5 years and over, pregnant women at any stage of pregnancy and people aged 65 years and over attending your pharmacy.

#### Influenza vaccines can be co-administered with most other vaccines

- Influenza vaccines can be co-administered with most other vaccines including dTpa, RSV, pneumococcal and COVID-19 vaccines. Refer to the <u>Australian Immunisation Handbook</u> for more information about co-administration.
- As per the Australian Immunisation Handbook, Fluad Quad and Shingrix administration should be separated by a few days.

#### Preparing your pharmacy

- Ensure your pharmacy software can report vaccinations to the **Australian Immunisation Register** (AIR). Reporting of all vaccinations is **mandatory**. Further information is available at <u>https://www.servicesaustralia.gov.au/proda-provider-digital-access.</u>
- Pharmacist immunisers will need to complete the Australian Immunisation Register Application to Register as a Vaccination Provider and NSW Pharmacist declaration form to register as a vaccination provider with the Australian Immunisation Register available at https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/application-air-provider.aspx.
- Ensure your pharmacy is **registered for online vaccine ordering with the NSW Vaccine Centre** (<u>https://www.health.nsw.gov.au/immunisation/Pages/guidance-for-pharmacists-NIP-vaccines.aspx</u>).

#### Influenza vaccine pre-allocation can be confirmed from Monday 17 February

- Your first order will be pre-allocated to ensure equitable and timely vaccine distribution to all providers in NSW.
- From **Thursday 13 February 2025**, you will receive email instructions from the NSW Vaccine Centre with details on how to accept the pre-allocation, please check your junk folder.
- You will be able to review and confirm your influenza pre-allocation from **9am Monday 17 February 2025 to 4.30pm Friday 7 March 2025. Only confirmed orders will be delivered**.
- Subsequent orders can be made online once you have received your initial order and will be delivered once all pre-allocated influenza vaccine orders have been distributed. Only order enough vaccines required for use in a maximum four-week period.
- There may be limits placed on subsequent orders to ensure equitable vaccine distribution to all providers in NSW.
- Only schedule influenza vaccination clinics once vaccine supplies are received.

#### Vaccine deliveries will commence from late March 2025

- Influenza vaccine deliveries will commence when the vaccines become available, and orders will be despatched to practices who have reviewed and confirmed their first order pre-allocation.
- Due to the volume of orders at the beginning of the season, it takes around four weeks for the NSW Vaccine Centre to deliver all first influenza vaccine orders.
